FREE COMPUTER TABLETS FOR FARINGTON CHILDREN

Scores of local children are set to benefit from £4,000 of investment in computer tablets to improve home learning.

Whilst South Ribble Borough Council has used money provided by the Government to support remote learning for children in the borough, some Farington families in need, unfortunately, have not benefitted.

Your Parish Councillors were deeply concerned for these families and wanted to take action to make sure no child was left behind.

Chairman of Farington Parish Council, Cllr Paul Wharton-Hardman, said; "This past year has been very difficult on our children. Having had so much time out of the classroom has meant some of them have lagged behind their classmates.

"Not every family can afford a computer at home for their child to do their homework and to log in to online classes.

"As a Parish Council we felt we wanted to use some of the resources available to us for the benefit of local children during these difficult times. £4,000 will help us help local schools purchase some computer tablets that can be loaned to local families in need."

If you have a child in need of a computer tablet at home and cannot afford one, then please take this leaflet to your child's school and ask them to apply to the Parish Council clerk on your behalf.

Popular with dog walkers, families and anglers all year round, the Parish Council has supported the Withnell Anglers and helped maintain the site for everyone's enjoyment.


Day fishing permits are available from the Lostock Hall Tackle Box on Watkin Lane in Lostock Hall.
